The best connection between South America and South-East Asia ever.

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Executive Summary: Buenos Aires-Perth-Singapore air connectivity prefeasibility

In this report ArCham presents a basic pre-feasibility study of the air connection of Buenos Aires-Perth-Singapore.

This route connects three continents; Asia, Oceania and South America. Nowadays, the PER-SIN connection transports more than 1 million passengers (inbound and outbound). The PER-EZE connection through the South Pole takes approximately 15 hours and offers a unique alternative route for tourism and business between Singapore, Australia and Argentina.

- Buenos Aires Perth will save 9 hours' flight and take 15 hours less.
- Buenos Aires Singapore will save 3 hours' flight and take 10 hours less than the best existing option.
- Perth is better connected than Auckland to some of the biggest airports in earth such us Jakarta, Singapore, Hong Kong, Bangkok, Guangzhou, etc.
- According to the BBC Report "Asia's travel boom", approximately 1 million people fly from Asia to Latin America each year.
- The north pole flights went from cero in the late 90's to 5,000 per year today.
- Boeing confirmed that the new airplanes can easily fly over Antarctica.
- Only few small changes are required in the Air Service Agreements in Argentina, Australia and Singapore.

1.2 Perth vs Dubai hub

There are not direct flights from Buenos Aires to Dubai, but we present the possibility as an option to connect Buenos Aires with Singapore. Current flight stops in Rio de Janeiro and takes 18:30 instead of 16:40 as it is presented in the next table.




- 35 per cent of all ASX-listed companies are headquartered in Perth. 76 per cent of listed companies in Perth are from the materials and energy sectors
- Strategic location to the Asia Pacific and Indian Ocean growth markets with access to capital
- The shortest travel times from an Australian capital to most Asia-Pacific and Indian Ocean markets



3 Tail winds

Perth and Buenos Aires are located diametrically opposite with the south pole in the middle therefore flights will always travel east and use tail winds.



Effective Still Air Distance (ESAD)


Routes in red are 200NM longer than the orange "shortest" route but because of the tail route ESAD is even lower making the flights shorter in time. Next table shows the Effective Still Air Distance estimations.²

4 Extended Diversion Time Operations (EDTO)

This is one of the most remote routes in the world due to the lack of available alternate aerodromes, comparable with the existing routes when traveling from Perth to Buenos Aires. However, when travelling from Buenos Aires to Perth going east there is an area where 2 engine airplanes cannot operate under ETOPS330.

As an opportunity to investigate further we found that Port-aux-Français had a project to set up an aerodrome that didn't progress due to lack of budget.

5 People logistics

Current traffic and forecasted growth present the option Buenos Aires – Perth – Singapore as a high potential option:

- There are 47,000 passengers travelling from Argentina to Southeast Asia, the volume increased 35% in 2016.³
- 227,000 passengers travelled from South America to Southeast Asia in 2016 with a grow of 15% from 2015.⁴
- The movement of passengers between Singapore and Perth in 2015 was 1,061,213 (536,990 outbound & 524,223 inbound). Seat utilisation of aircrafts was at approximately 80%.
- According to .ID (the population experts in Perth), the Census 2016 identified 9,965 Perth inhabitants who speak Spanish at home and 6,640 who speak Portuguese⁵. This means that in Perth alone, there is an approximate market of 15,000 people who would use this direct flight.
- A significant customer segment to target would be Latin American exchange students. In 2016, there were 29,440 Brazilians in Australia on a student visa⁶.
- Western Australia is the state with the highest rate of movement in Australia, with short-term resident departures being 532 movements per 1,000 people⁷.
- The population of South America exceed 400 million⁸. Having a direct flight between Buenos Aires and Perth represents the opportunity to open the South American travellers market to Western Australia.
- In 2015, 61,540 Latin American visitors arrived to Singapore. The average annual growth of these tourists between 2006-2015 has been 9.8%⁹.
- Singapore is conveniently located between three of the most populous countries in the world: China, India and Indonesia (combined population of 3 billion¹⁰). It is also close to a range of popular tourist destinations in the region such as Thailand, Vietnam and the

Philippines, which would make it a good strategic hub in the region for future travellers from South America¹¹.

- Between March 2016-February 2017, 15 million passengers used Singapore Changi Airport to connect between flights from other countries¹².
- In 2015, 207,900 visitors from countries in Asia and Oceania arrived in Argentina¹³.
- Between 2014 and 2015, the departures from Argentina towards countries in Asia and Oceania grew by 17.2% (from 116,992 in 2014 to 136,574 in 2015) ¹⁴.
- According to the BBC Report "Asia's travel boom", approximately 1 million people fly from Asia to Latin America each year¹⁵.
- According to Airbus company forecasts, the annual growth rate in passenger traffic between South America and Asia and Oceania will exceed the worldwide 2015-2034 rate by approximately 50%¹⁶.

- According to CAPA (Centre for Aviation) Report "Asia to Latin America Lots of distance, lots of options, but little direct service"¹⁷, it is necessary to find strategic hubs to connect Asia and Latin America.
- According to OAG (Aviation Worldwide Limited) forecasts, scheduled flights to/from and within South America will grow 20% between 2017 and 2019¹⁸
- IMF forecasts that Argentina will have a steady GDP growth in the next 5 years.¹⁹

• In Ezeiza International Airport in Argentina (EZE), carrier added 12% more seats in July 2016 than in the previous year.²⁰

6 Cargo logistics

According to the Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore air cargo from Singapore to Australia
is already 190 metric tons per year while arrivals from Argentina are 280 metric tons per
year.

7 Technical

 According to Boeing, 5 different models of their airplanes can be equipped to travel across the South Pole.²¹

8 Legal

8.1 What needs to change in the service Agreements?

8.1.1 Australia with Argentina

- Include the Indian ocean cities in the Air Services Agreement with Argentina. It shouldn't
 be limited to the pacific. For example, as it is today Qantas cannot fly Perth Buenos
 Aires.
- Include further points in South East Asia for the Argentine nominated Airlines including but not limited to Kuala Lumpur, Singapore, Jakarta and Guangzhou. In the same way that South America and Europe are allowed for the airline nominated by Australia.

8.1.2 Australia with Singapore and Malaysia

• Include Buenos Aires as a point beyond in the air service agreement with Malaysia and Singapore to create competition.

Highlights

8.1.3 Argentina have an asymmetric air services agreement with Australia²².

- The Australian nominated airline can land in Buenos Aires and continue to South America or Europe.
- Perth is not included because it is in the pacific, it is not clear why it is limited to the points in the Pacific.
